Use containers

Put a bin in your bathroom for anything that isn't pee, poo or paper




Bag it and bin it

Use a sink strainer or drain protector to stop hair blocking your drain





Top tips to help **Keep It Clear**







Use scented nappy sacks, twisted and then tied at the neck for any rubbish that may cause a smell



Use a nappy bin

Put a dedicated nappy bin next to your changing table. It will wrap and seal used nappies to avoid odours



Put the poo in the loo

Empty the poo from a soiled nappy into the loo before bagging it to stop your bin smelling



Try reusable products

Have you considered reusable nappies and wipes? They're cheaper and kinder to the environment



Recycle your disposables

If you recycle, there are services that offer collections Check with your local council to see if this is available in your area



Be prepared

Make sure you always have nappy sacks in your change bag, so you can dispose of used nappies responsibly when out and about




