Most of the Council Tax we collect from you is used for services that are provided by Kent County Council, Kent Police and Crime Commissioner and Kent Fire & Rescue Service plus some is used by the parish and town councils.

Only 10% of what you pay is used to fund borough council services, which on average is 50p per day.

Although Council Tax is set locally by democratically elected local members at a public meeting of Full Council, the Secretary of State has the power to set a limit above which a referendum must be held. For 2020/21 the limits allowed Kent County Council to increase their Council Tax by up to 4 per cent, comprising a core 2 per cent, plus an extra 2 per cent provided this is attributable to funding adult social care.

The Secretary of State made an offer to adult social care authorities (adult social care authorities are local authorities which have functions under Part 1 of the Care Act 2014, namely county councils in England, district councils for an area in England for which there is no county council, London borough councils, the Common Council of the City of London and the Council of the Isles of Scilly).

The offer was the option of an adult social care authority being able to charge an additional precept on its Council Tax without holding a referendum, to assist the authority in meeting its expenditure on adult social care from the financial year 2016-17. It was originally made in respect of the financial years up to and including 2019-20. If the Secretary of State chooses to renew this offer in respect of a particular financial year, this is subject to the approval of the House of Commons.

Kent Police and Crime Commissioner has a limit of $\pounds 10$ which is 5.2 per cent increase over the previous year.

Tunbridge Wells Borough Council (TWBC) has a limit of £5 which is 2.8 per cent increase over the previous year.

Kent Fire and Rescue Service has a limit of 2 per cent increase over the previous year.

There are no set limits of increasing Council Tax for parish and town councils.

TWBC's Budget

This section gives you a breakdown of our income and expenditure.

Tunbridge Wells Borough Council's financial position remains sound but further significant pressures are ahead. The level of Council Tax reflects the need to deliver the Council's priorities and statutory services, and to strike the right balance with fees and charges and Council Tax payers.

Local Government shouldered the largest reduction in funding during the period of austerity, as the government tried to reduce the deficit caused by the banking and economic crisis. For 2020/21 TWBC will again receive zero revenue support grant meaning that the ability to fund local services is now dependent on growing the local economy and sharing in the proceeds of business rates growth.

The Government has developed a universal benchmark indicator called Spending Power to measure the revenue available to provide local services. TWBC has one of the lowest levels of Spending Power in Kent at just £245 per household and therefore must continue to seek further value for money in the services that are delivered. This is despite operating in one of the most expensive parts of the country combined with inflationary pressures and a rising population.



Special Expenses

The borough council also provides certain services in Capel, Southborough, Royal Tunbridge Wells and Rusthall for the benefit of those residents for which the council levies a special expenses charge only on Council Tax payers in those respective areas. This expenditure is included in the council's revenue budget.

Continued Priorities 2020/21

The Amelia at the Amelia Scott

Work has begun on the £16.2m project to create a new cultural and learning hub for Tunbridge Wells.

This is a joint project with Kent County Council with funding coming from both councils and the generous support of the National Lottery Heritage Fund and Arts Council England.

Willmott Dixon Interiors has been appointed to the project and work is due to complete in 2022.

New Local Plan

An extensive consultation took place in autumn 2019 on a new Draft Local Plan that set out how the need for more infrastructure, homes and jobs could be balanced with protecting the borough's highly valued environmental qualities.

Comments received are being carefully considered and appropriate amendments to the plan are being made. A further consultation will take place in due course.



New sports facilities

The Five Year Plan agreed that options will be investigated to provide new sports facilities so that access is improved and increased, including the possibility of a new site that can act as a focus for a variety of sporting activities.

New community centres

We are enabling and supporting town councils and parish councils to provide amenities within their local areas.

In Southborough work on site is progressing well and completion is expected to be in spring 2021. We are working with the town council to support them as they develop an effective business plan.

Paddock Wood Town Council has agreed the design elements of their scheme and the project is progressing towards the submission of a planning application.



Tackling congestion

We are working with Kent County Council to deliver the projects set out in our borough Transport Strategy to secure further funding to alleviate congestion and to promote active travel and reduce pollution.



Cross-party working group

The Council has a cross-party working group looking at the future of the Civic Complex, in particular, the Town Hall and the Assembly Hall Theatre.

These Grade 2 listed buildings were constructed around 80 years ago, and the cross-party group agree they need major repair to refurbish or redevelop into effective assets for the 21st century.

An interim report was taken to Full Council on 18 December 2019 and the group was given the mandate to discuss and consider the options for the site. A further report, outlining the group's plans for identifying and evaluating practical options alongside substantial public engagement, will be taken through the Council's decision-making process in due course.

Achievements 2019/20

In addition to the core services that the Council provides we support events and activities in the borough as well as launching initiatives that may benefit residents, businesses and visitors.

Some highlights

- Secured funding for accessibility improvements at High Brooms Station.
- Completed public realm improvements works in Royal Tunbridge Wells town centre.
- Another amazing season of ice skating at the rink in Calverley Grounds.
- Implemented a new recycling and waste contract to include kerbside glass collections, and introduced new garden waste service.
- Secured funding to continue rough sleeper initiative that addresses homelessness.
