- We are the first point of contact for business enquiries to the Council (see the Contact Us page on the Council's website).
- We manage the TWBC Business Portal pages, compile the monthly online TWbiz newsletter and manage the business social media accounts.
- We promote the borough as a destination for businesses and visitors and we manage the Visit Tunbridge Wells website, social media and work with partners such as Visit Kent
- We work with Kent County Highways and public transport operators (bus and rail) to improve the local transport network.
- We undertake research and commission reports relating to economic development.
- We bid for government funding when opportunities arise.
- We work together with Sevenoaks District Council and Tonbridge and Malling Borough Council as part of Invest West Kent (IWK).

Business Rates

The Non-Domestic Rates for Tunbridge Wells businesses are collected by the Mid Kent Rates Team. Information and support on Business Rates can be accessed via the Business Portal.

Register

If you are a new business, or have recently moved to the area, you will need to register with the Rates Team. You will need to provide (1) your full name, (2) your company name, (3) your full business address, (4) the date you moved in, (5) the date your lease started, and (6) details of any other premises occupied by your business.

Rate Relief

Businesses based solely at a premises with a Rateable Value of under £15,000 can obtain relief on their rates bills and those with a Rateable Value of under £12,000 will pay nothing at all. Additional reliefs relate to charitable use, land use, empty properties, rural locations, and sector specific support.

How are Business Rates calculated?

The business rates for a property are set by the Valuation Office Agency (VOA), based on the rateable value of the premises. The rateable value is an estimate of what it would cost to rent a property for one year, on a set valuation date. To find out the rateable value of a premises, please visit gov.uk/find-business-rates

Rural Rate Relief

You could get rural rate relief if your business is in an eligible rural area with a population below 3,000. To find and more and see if your business is eligible, please visit: www.gov.uk/apply-for-business-rate-relief/rural-rate-relief

You can pay via direct debit, online, telephone, internet banking or standing order.

Planning

Planning support for businesses can be accessed via the Business Portal.

When do you need planning permission?

Not all building work requires planning permission. You can check the Planning Portal to see which works require permission and which do not: planningportal.co.uk/permission.

However, please note, if your project involves a listed building, you will definitely require planning permission. Similarly, if your building is within a conservation area, permission may also be needed.

Moving into a new premises

When moving to a new premises you should check whether you need consent for a change of use, updating the frontage, signage and logos (advertising) and internal works (if your building is listed).

Please be aware, when moving to a new premises, it is up to you (the business) to check you have permission for the right use. If you are not sure, please check with the estate agent or our Planning department.

Pre-application advice

The Council encourages you to seek advice before submitting a formal planning application. The pre-application advice service is known to improve the quality of planning submissions and will speed up the process from submission to planning decision. This will also reduce the likelihood of you incurring costs for the submission of an unacceptable proposal.

The Planning Team's pre-application service provides you with the following benefits:

- Consistency in dealing with your preapplication submission and any subsequent applications for planning permission.
- Information on key planning policies and previous planning decisions.
- Advice in relation to all relevant planning matters and the planning merits of the proposal.
- Informal comments and guidance, which are without prejudice, on the content, construction and presentation of an application likely to satisfy the council's planning policies.
- Advice on the documents to be submitted with your planning application.

Building Control

The Council's Building Control Team can help you find out if building regulations apply to your project.

Building control is often required when:

- Replacing doors, windows and roof lights
- Constructing a new building or extending an existing one
- Structurally altering an existing building
- Creating an agricultural premises where the floor area exceeds 50m2
- Installing and replacing electrical wiring

To check whether you need approval, contact our Building Control Administration Team in the first instance on 01892 554124. Free preapplication meetings can be arranged.

Licensing and Permits

Licensing for businesses can be accessed via the Business Portal.



If you are a business operating in the borough, you may need a license to operate. Licenses are needed for alcohol and entertainment venues, business and street trading, gambling, taxis and private hire operators. Licenses are also required in relation to keeping animals and ensuring their welfare.



Before you apply you may wish to read our 'Organising Events - Can Do Guide! Send a request to events@tunbridgewells.gov.uk and they will email you a copy.

Please remember to apply at least 12-weeks in advance of your event, as you could be requested to attend the Tunbridge Wells Safety Advisory Group to talk about the safety provisions, or you may need to apply for a temporary road closure or other licences and permissions.

Corporate procurement

Corporate procurement describes the contracts and orders the Council places with businesses and suppliers. Orders and contracts can range in value from a few hundred pounds to millions. Details of the council's spending with suppliers can be found on our transparency pages.

In order to get the best value for money, a significant part of our procurement is carried out under direct contract. Some procurement is undertaken under joint or consortium arrangements. Many contracts, particularly for services, cover periods of more than one year.

Our searchable contracts register provides information about the contracts the council (and other local authorities) have in place.

Visit Tunbridge Wells (VTW) is the official tourist information and acting destination management organisation for the Tunbridge Wells Borough, working in collaboration with Visit Kent, Visit Britain and other key partners. Through our marketing strategy we promote the borough locally, nationally and internationally. We run a tourist information website which receives over 325,000 views a year, social media channels, and digital and print campaigns.

We also organise regular networking events and take part in business support programmes and opportunities to help local tourism & hospitality businesses secure support.



The BID was formed in 2018 following a ballot and is funded by levy paying businesses to increase footfall and offer support to town centre businesses. RTWT has a voluntary Board of Directors from across the town that represents the various sectors located in Royal Tunbridge Wells. The BID's office is currently located in a former retail unit on the High Street.

Recent BID initiatives have included:

- Promotion and marketing programmes (at London termini and on bus backs) in collaboration with Visit Tunbridge Wells
- Installation of footfall counters across the town

- Improvements to the streetscene
- Provision of Christmas lighting
- Creation of new events to increase footfall including Art Week and Coronation
- Grants for town centre events and cultural venues
- Free training (e.g. first aid and social media) portal for levy-paying businesses
- Engagement with/lobbying the Council on town centre issues of concern to businesses

Rural Business Support

Rural businesses in Tunbridge Wells can access funding and support from the Council, wider support organisations and the Department for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs (DEFRA).

West Kent Rural Grants Scheme

In Autumn 2023 rural businesses in Tunbridge Wells will be able to make a pre-application for grants as part of the West Kent Rural Grants Scheme. Grants of £2,000 to £25,000 will be available to support jobs, communities, economic growth and visitor and heritage destinations. The funding is for capital projects and match funding is required.

Eligible local organisations must be within a rural area as defined by DEFRA. You can check this using the interactive Magic Map or our REPF map showing eligible areas.


