Road Hierarchy

A. Inter-Urban Hierarchy

(i) **PRIMARY ROUTES**

The preferred route linking urban centres of more than 25,000 population and passing within 5 miles of those centres and having no physical restrictions. These are already identified in the approved Kent Structure Plan (e.g. motorways, trunk roads, primary 'A' roads).

(ii) SECONDARY ROUTES

The preferred route linking urban centres of 10,000 to 25,000 population, located within 5 miles of those centres and having no physical restrictions. Routes passing through a number of smaller settlements may also justify this classification if the traffic flow exceeds 5,000 vehicles per day. Roads parallel to motorways and giving an alternative route should also be secondary routes (e.g. other 'A' roads).

(iii) LOCAL ROUTES

Routes linking urban centres of 3,000 to 10,000 population with each other and with the primary/secondary route network (e.g. 'B' and 'C' roads).

(iv) ACCESS ROUTES

Routes giving access to routes above them in the hierarchy.

B. Urban Hierarchy

In assessing proposals for development the Local Planning Authority will take account of the road hierarchy based on the functions of the routes as set out in the following classification:

A) PRIMARY DISTRIBUTORS

These roads form the primary network for the towns and villages as a whole. Where capacity exists, all longer-distance traffic to, from and within the towns and villages should be channelled onto the primary distributors.

B) DISTRICT DISTRIBUTORS

These roads carry traffic from primary distributors to the residential and business districts of the towns and villages and distribute traffic between districts.

C) LOCAL DISTRIBUTORS

These roads distribute traffic within residential, industrial and business areas. They form the link between District Distributors and Access Roads.

D) ACCESS ROADS

These roads give direct access to buildings and land within residential, industrial and business areas and include privately-owned access roads.
